

# The future cooperation of the EU27 and the UK

**PROTEUS seminar 2020** 





# **Course description**

After leaving the European Union on 31 January 2020, the UK and the EU will negotiate a new partnership. "We are ready to design a new partnership with zero tariffs, zero quotas, zero dumping. A partnership that goes well beyond trade and is unprecedented in scope", von der Leyen explained in her speech on 8th January 2020, while pointing out that the EU would work for solutions that uphold its integrity, its Single Market and its Customs Union.

How could these future relations possibly look like? Will the EU's institutional relations to Norway or Switzerland serve as a role model? In this seminar, students will take part in a European Council simulation game which will focus on the negotiations about the future relations between the EU and the UK. It will draft a proposal about a new partnership.
